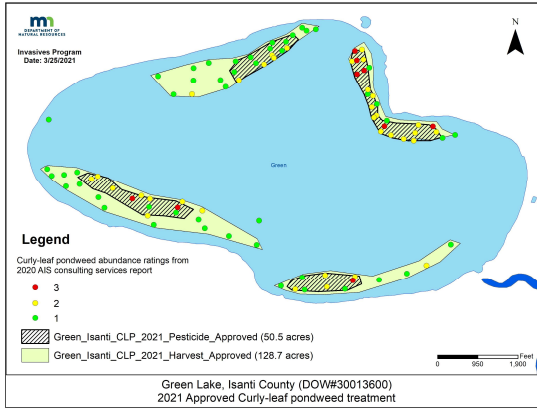


REDUCING NUTRIENT FLOW INTO LAKE REDUCES RATE OF WEED & ALGAE GROWTH

GLID's continuing focus is reducing the amount of nutrients going into lake. Also, focusing on removing nutrient-producing weeds from our lake and dock areas helps! A ton of lake weeds contain 9.36 lbs of Nitrogen(N), 4.7 lbs Phosphorus (TP), 5.63 lbs of Potassium (K). All fertilizer that promotes lake weed infestations! ONE pound of TP produces 500 pounds of algae!

ALERT: Patches of BLUE-GREEN Algae may happen again. **IF IN DOUBT, STAY OUT!**

Green Lake had 50.5 acres of bad CLP weed areas treated in early May via DNR Permit. **PLEASE leave buoys in place.** Post treatment & EWM survey happens in June.



HAPPENING NOW>> GLID and Isanti SWCD are using Federal Clean Water Act Section 319 funds with a goal of delisting Green Lake from the impaired waters list by reducing watershed runoff nutrients, managing AIS weeds, and improving overall water quality. More info at GLID website.

GREEN LAKE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

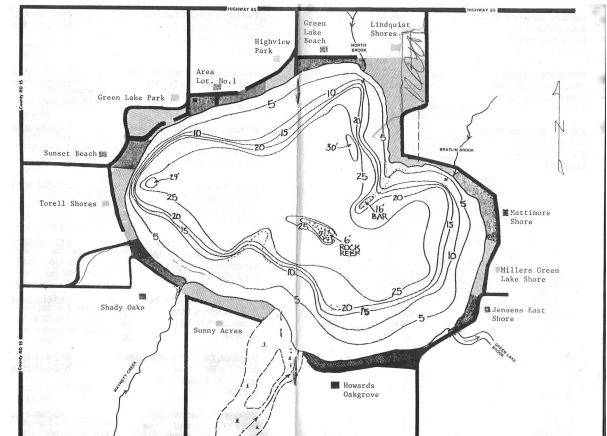

Clean In – Clean Out Boat Guidelines

The DNR requires all boats and equipment are

weed clean going in and weed clean after pulling out of lakes and rivers. This Includes draining ALL water from live wells and remove drain plugs. ALL to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.



Note: Horrible Zebra Mussels were found in nearby Spec Lake.. need to keep them out of Green Lake!

GREEN LAKE SHORELINE RESTORATION PROJECTS CONTINUE IN 2021

Green Lake Shoreline Restorations continue to be a nutrient reduction focus area. GLID has funds to help Green Lake landowners restore eroding or non-buffered shorelines. Green Lake Sub-Watershed Retrofit Analysis reported 95 lakeshore sites that were candidates.

The Lake Steward “Score Your Shore” is now available from GLID website.

TIP: A lush Shoreline Buffer Zone (within 25-50ft from water's edge) of native plants prevents harmful runoff of silt and nutrients from entering the lake.

TIP: Keep removed weeds 50ft away from water's edge. **OR take weeds (only) to FREE compost pile at Wyanett Township Grader Shed!**
