GREEN LAKE INVASIVE WEED TREATMENTS

Learn how to benefit from this as a lake homeowner below.

GLID has spent many hours with the DNR and SWCD to understand the many parameters and restrictions of AIS weed management. We are trying to balance the need for reduced weed infested lake waters with water quality, safety, less chemical usage, and fish habitat.

We need to continue focusing on killing invasive weeds in the spring to reduce the growth and nutrients. The GLID is working with the DNR via permits to use the safer Diquat herbicide on 50 acres to help control both Curley Leaf Pondweed and Eurasian Water Milfoil, at the same time reducing chemical usage and saving a lot of money.

GLID chose Lake Restoration for weed management, which is also available to lake homeowner's dock areas.

GREEN LAKE SHORELINE RESTORATION PROJECTS CONTINUE IN 2020

Green Lake Shoreline Restorations continue to be a nutrient reduction focus area. Isanti County SWCD is once again providing a \$10,000 grant matched by GLID's \$5,000 to help Green Lake landowners restore eroding or non-buffered shorelines.

2020 nominations are now being accepted by **Dan Howard**.

Did you know the Green Lake Sub-Watershed Retrofit Analysis reported 95 lakeshore sites that were candidates? Per the report, if all 95 were completed, the total Phosphorus flow into Green Lake from those areas would be reduced by a whopping **44%!**
